

Worksheet „95 Theses of Young People around the World“

500 years ago, Martin Luther protested with 95 theses against indulgences. He called attention to a problem that prevailed in his time and what he wanted to change. At the same time he pointed to alternatives, thereby laying the foundations for a renewal of the Church.

Even in today's world there are things that we would like to change. Last summer you were called to formulate your "Protest for the Future". Numerous submissions showed what today annoys young people in schools, churches and the world and how they imagine a better future. From all entries, we have compiled a selection of 95 theses.

Read the theses and consider which problems are reflected and which visions of a better future young people of today express.

Individual Work:

Select 5 theses which you think are particularly important. You can address particular serious problems or identify particular desirable future images.

Post your selected theses to a moderation card, a piece of paper or mark them in the theses paper.

Group Work:

Set up working groups (of 3 to 5 people) and present your selected theses. Compare and discuss your theses and select once again 5 theses that are absolutely central for your group. Write these theses on the worksheet.

Design a poster on which you present your selected theses in a creative way and present it to the other working groups. Exchange afterwards with the other working groups on the different posters!
